The Door County Art League (DCAL) was organized in 1986 for the purpose of developing active community interest in the field of creative arts. Membership is open to artists and all other persons interested in and supportive of the visual arts in Door County. Since our first season we have offered a variety of programs to members and guests wishing to enrich their lives through the knowledge, use and enjoyment of art.

Meetings are held monthly on the fourth Monday of the month with the exception of March, November and December. Special demonstrations and presentations are featured during the summer months; winter meetings are generally participatory. All meetings are convivial with free exchange of ideas, techniques and suggestions. Notices of meetings as well as updates on artists, opportunities and news flashes are available through the newsletter and the informative website.

DCAL members are invited to exhibit in venues throughout the County. Exhibition guidelines vary, but these opportunities allow novice artists to show their work alongside Door County's master artists, enabling them to grow artistically as well as professionally.

In addition to meetings and exhibition opportunities, there are active groups like the DCAL-PAP, the plein air painters. A schedule of Wednesday mornings is in effect from May through October; some hardy artists also paint outdoors throughout the year. Check the website calendar weekly for painting locations.

Membership is available to all persons interested in promoting and enjoying the creative arts in Door County. The League welcomes everyone interested in the arts, in making new friends, in associating with artists and supporting them, becoming inspired, gaining knowledge and trying their hands at new pursuits. Our members may be photographers, sculptors, potters, fiber artists, as well as watercolorists or painters working in oils, acrylics, pastels, mixed media and folk arts. Skills range from art lovers to novices to artists with national recognition. All members are encouraged to participate as actively as possible in the League's activities, including its leadership positions. Knowledge of business management, marketing, sales, accounting and leadership abilities can all be of great value to the Art League.
